NEW ZEALAND DISASTER FUND SIX-MONTH REPORT

FEBRUARY - AUGUST 2023

It's been six months since Cyclone Gabrielle and the devastating severe weather events of early 2023. This report has been produced by New Zealand Red Cross to provide an update on our work with affected communities.

I wanted to take a moment to reflect on the six months since Cyclone Gabrielle and the other weather events in January and February that wreaked havoc on communities in Aotearoa New Zealand.

We have now committed the majority of the New Zealand Disaster Fund. We will ensure that all remaining funds are committed by February 2024.

Throughout this process, we have been mindful of balancing the need to respond quickly with spending the Fund wisely. We have taken time to carefully allocate funds in a manner that will benefit the greatest number of vulnerable people in the affected communities.

On my visits to the Hawke's Bay, Tairāwhiti, and other affected areas

this year, I've witnessed first-hand the devastation and heartbreak these weather events have caused. I've also witnessed the incredible strength of communities working together to help each other out.

Collaboration has also been at the heart of our approach. We have worked closely with councils, civil defence emergency management groups, iwi, hapū, marae, community leaders, and government agencies. Through these partnerships, we have gained valuable insights into the needs and priorities of communities. This collective effort has guided us in using the New Zealand Disaster Fund to its fullest potential, ensuring it is spent in ways that truly make a difference.

It is only through the immense generosity of New Zealanders that we have been able to facilitate this mahi. I want to emphasise that every single donation to the Fund, along with any interest earned, is dedicated to supporting and assisting affected people.

I'd also like to thank the many Red Cross people who have been on this journey supporting the response and recovery in affected communities, many of whom have been impacted by these events personally.

As we move forward, I am filled with gratitude for your unwavering support and trust in our organisation. Together, we will continue to make meaningful strides in supporting our communities as they recover.

THE FUND IS BEING SPENT ACROSS THREE PROGRAMMES OF WORK:

- ✓ The **Response and Recovery Programme** provides support in the form of people, services and goods. It includes our immediate response on the ground and is funding longer-term recovery initiatives such as psychosocial training and the Red Cross Home Bundles. We have committed \$6.5 million to this programme.
- ✓ The **Partnership Grants Programme** provides grants to organisations supporting community response and recovery. We have issued more than \$14 million in grants to enable a wide range of community-based recovery initiatives and activities.
- ✓ The **Resilience Investment Programme** is focused on better preparing communities for future events.

KEY EVENTS

10 Jan Cyclone Hale

27 Jan Auckland floods

Our teams deploy and help run Civil Defence Centres (CDCs). We supply emergency bedding, provide psychological first aid, and conduct needs assessments.

1 Feb More flooding in Auckland

Our teams continue to provide welfare support and perform needs assessments at CDCs.

14 Feb Cyclone Gabrielle

National State of Emergency declared. Our teams deploy across affected areas to help set up and actively support CDCs.

14 Feb – 11 Mar

Our logistics team delivers stretcher beds, equipment such as generators and emergency communications equipment, and clean-up supplies into cyclone-hit areas. Our Disaster Welfare Support Teams provide psychological first aid, conduct needs assessments, and continue to help CDC operations.

March 2023

Our specialist trainers begin providing psychosocial training to help people cope.

3 Apr – 25 May

The Partnership Grants Programme opens to applications from community organisations.

April 2023

Our Red Cross Home Bundles pilot begins.

15 June

Total grants allocated under the Partnership Grants Programme reaches \$10 million.

July 2023

Our Red Cross Home Bundles programme is extended into additional areas in Tairāwhiti, Wairoa, and Auckland.

5 Aug

New Zealand Disaster Fund closes to new donations.

14 Aug

Six months after Cyclone Gabrielle, the New Zealand Disaster Fund has received over \$27 million in donations and spent or committed more than \$20 million.



\$6.5 MILLION ALLOCATED

This includes our immediate emergency response on the ground and our work providing the supplies and services that communities need.

Some of our activities:



Deploying our Disaster Welfare and Support Team volunteers to help set up and run Civil Defence Centres and provide Psychological First Aid during the emergency, and assess needs afterwards.



Funding emergency food parcels.



Delivering items like generators, dehumidifiers, water blasters, and first aid kits to support community clean-up.



Distributing home clean-up kits, which include items like brooms, shovels, dust masks, tarpaulins, cleaning products, and overalls.



Providing psychosocial training in affected communities.



Providing Red Cross Home Bundles – helping those most in need replace damaged furniture and other household items.



PSYCHOSOCIAL TRAINING

The New Zealand Disaster Fund has been providing psychosocial training free of cost to participants in affected communities.

This includes training in Psychological First Aid, which equips people who are assisting others to recognise distress and provide emotional and practical support. We have also offered our Recovery Matters workshops, which help people directly impacted manage their own feelings after a disaster. They learn about the science of stress, and practical tips and tools to help themselves – and others – through the recovery process. We have provided this psychosocial training to 672 people across 56 courses in affected areas.



RED CROSS HOME BUNDLES

The Red Cross Home Bundles programme is helping people replace furniture and other household items damaged in the severe weather events.

As people return to their homes, or move to new accommodation, we are supporting those most in need by providing bundles of new household items such as whiteware, beds and bedding, living room furniture and heaters. They are only available to the most vulnerable households that meet a set criteria.

We're working with local partners that know their communities well, such as community and iwi organisations or council welfare teams, who will refer households to the programme.

The Red Cross Home Bundles programme is underway in Auckland, Tologa Bay, Te Karaka, and Wairoa, and will be rolled out into other affected areas in the coming weeks.

While \$5.5 million has now been committed to the programme, it may be some time until some of these Red Cross Home Bundles are allocated, as we wait for people to move back into their homes. For some, this may not be until next year, but the funds have been committed and we will be there, waiting to help when they are ready.

A \$1.1 million Liveable Homes grant has been used to restore hot water, gas, and drainage systems to help get people in Wairoa back into their homes.

GRANTS TO SUPPORT RESPONSE AND RECOVERY

Every community’s path is different after a disaster. Needs change quickly and can vary across different communities.

We provided grants to community organisations helping people affected by Cyclone Gabrielle and the severe weather events of early 2023. Supporting local organisations helped make sure response and recovery work was community-led and met local needs.

We are supporting groups delivering services and support like:

-  Providing food and temporary accommodation
-  Replacing clothing, bedding, and other essentials
-  Providing financial hardship support to individuals and whānau
-  Supporting volunteer clean-up and repair efforts with equipment, food, transportation, and coordination
-  Providing mental health services and community connectedness activities
-  Restoring temporary access to things like water supply, power, septic tanks, and communications
-  Repairing and restoring community hubs, marae, and other common facilities

The Association is using a \$100,000 grant to help ease costs on hard-hit fruit growers and offer growers, their workers, and their families the support of a psychologist.



“WE NORMALLY DO ABOUT 100 KAI PACKS A WEEK. IN THE CYCLONE EVENT, WE DID OVER 1,700 PACKS IN TWO WEEKS. ON THE DAY THAT WE RECEIVED NOTIFICATION OF THAT FUNDING, WE WERE EXPERIENCING ANOTHER WEATHER EVENT. IT WAS A HUGE RELIEF FOR OUR COMMUNITY THAT WE COULD CONTINUE TO SUPPORT IN THE WAY THAT WAS NEEDED.”

A grant of \$50,000 supported the organisation’s food bank programme, which experienced an exponential increase in demand after the flooding in Auckland and after Cyclone Gabrielle. South Kaipara is a region that often gets cut off when flooding occurs.

The charity received a \$30,000 grant to support people in need after the Auckland floods with goods like warm clothing, bedding, and toiletries.

THE CYCLONE WAS THE TIPPING POINT, THE CATALYST THAT ACTUALLY MADE THINGS UNMANAGEABLE.”

The Centre received a \$53,260 grant to provide mental health services in the Hawke’s Bay after the cyclone.

A \$21,000 grant is supporting Association volunteers’ efforts to cook and distribute hot meals every week to flood-affected families.
